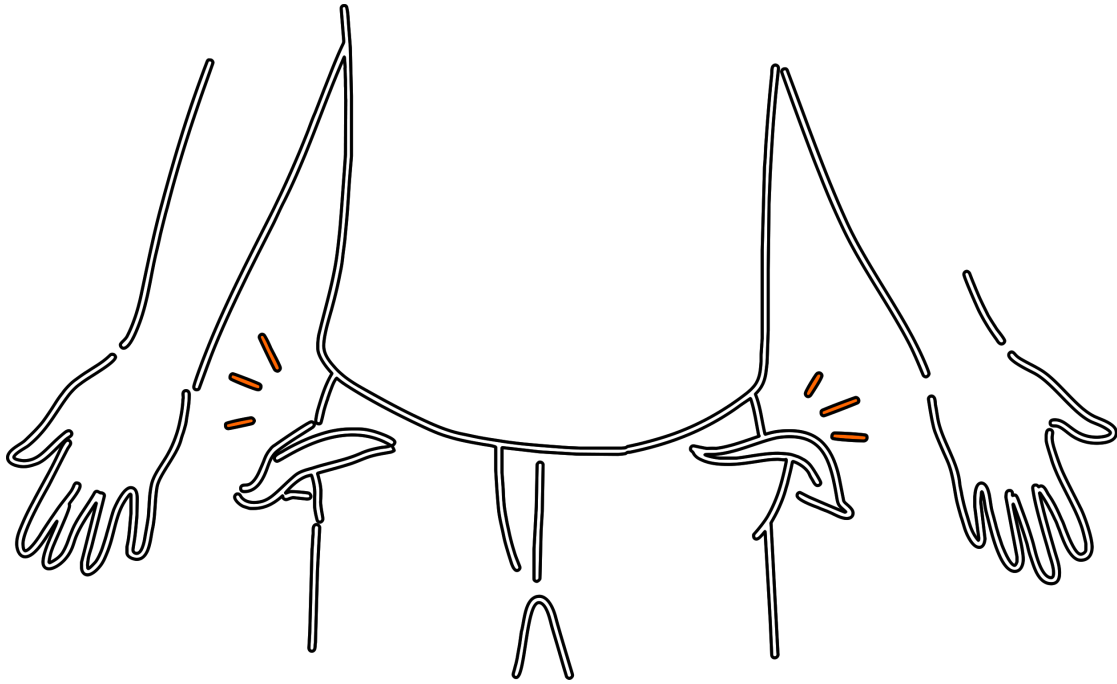


Zakah is a **special Sadaqah**. We **must** give **Zakah once a year**.



Sadaqah Jariyah refers to a charitable contribution that gives ongoing rewards. For instance, when we dig a well or plant a tree, the person who made that charitable donation continues to benefit if people or animals derive benefit from it.





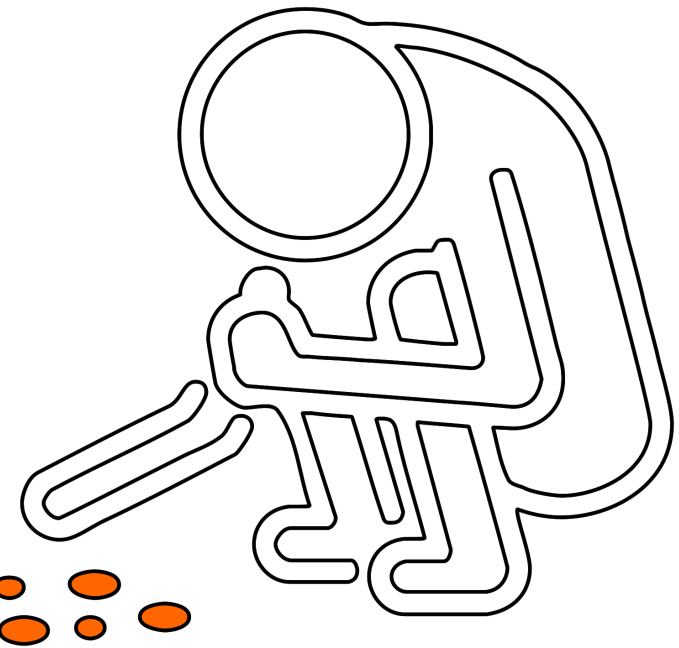

Lailatul Qadr is better than a thousand months. It is on one of the odd nights in the last 10 days of Ramadhan.



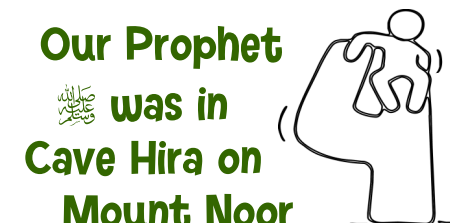
It was on Laylatul Qadr (the Night of Power) in the month of Ramadhan that the Qur'an was revealed.

Our Prophet ﷺ was in Cave Hira on Mount Noor when Angel Jibrael عليه السلام related the first five verses (Wahi).

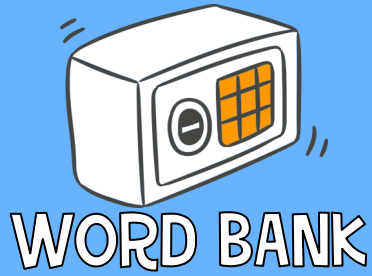

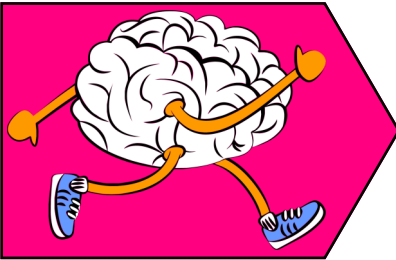

A sunnah prayer which is carried out in Ramadhan only. It has 20 raka'at performed in units of 2.

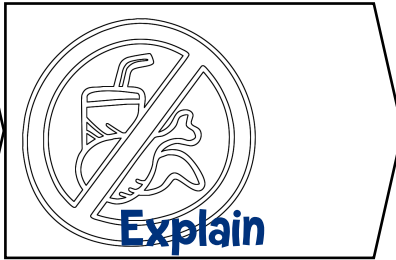

To spend some time in seclusion for the worship of Allah. (Masjid for men and Home for women).

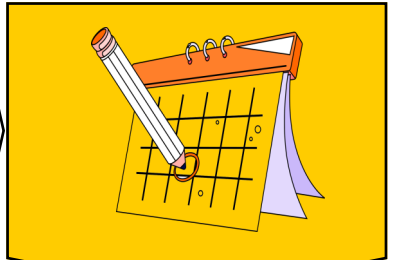

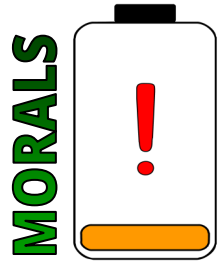


Huzayfah رضي الله عنه was a Sahabi who was known as the 'keeper of secrets'. He was asked about the start of the fitna.

People are more dishonest with frequent breaches of trust.

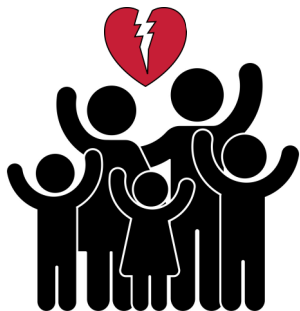

Family Ties

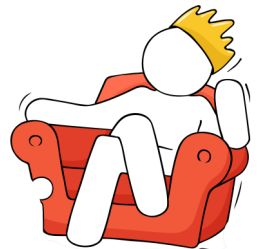
Family ties are broken and children disrespect their parents. In this day and age, this is common and is increasing as time goes by.
